Board's Welcome & Business

- Outdoor classroom plans update the architect's plans have been received. The plan is to meet with stakeholders including Facilities and discuss the plans.

Principals' Update

- o Dr. Jocelyn noted that teachers have been out sick.
- O Doing assessments on students now. This has been aided by interventionists in the district to evaluate these assessments. The groups are built after they meet with teachers.
- o WIN (What I Need) will start the first week of February.
- Reading academy has been successful and is up to 70 students now. COVID money that funds this will run out in June. The cost is \$20,000-30,000.
- The school council meeting was held today and went well. Dr. Jocelyn went over his objectives as principal including more parent events, WIN, community initiatives, etc. Now they are starting the mentoring program with teachers and students as well. He also wants to continue reading academy with funding next year. He would also like to promote academic discourse conversation in the classroom. This would help the students with their writing, social skills, math concepts, etc. It pairs kids with other kids to explain problems, so it's not just the teacher explaining concepts.
